· Voters may visit their local voter registration office during regular business hours through today's deadline to vote absentee in-person.

The last chance to vote in this year's mid-term election occurs tomorrow when you can visit your local polling place.

The Election Day forecast is for showers and a thunderstorm possibility. The National Weather Service predicts an 80% chance of precipitation with new rainfall amounts between three quarters and one inch possible compounded by a southwest wind from 5 to 14 mph, with gusts as high as 21 mph.

Rain gear and an umbrella could be very useful for the dash from your vehicle to the poll and even more useful if you have to stand in line outside.

Voters can find more information about the Nov. 6 General Election at Virginia Department of Elections Citizen Portal, <u>vote.virginia.gov.</u>

The polls are open from 6 a.m. until 7 p.m. If you are in line by 7 p.m. will be able to vote. There are 2,441 precincts in the Commonwealth. You can find your polling location by visiting the Department of Elections Citizen Portal at: vote.virginia.gov.

As of Oct. 29, 5,667,787 Virginians had registered to vote in the Nov. 6, 2018 election. (That number will change as mailed registration applications that have not yet been received but were postmarked by the deadline, Oct. 15, are processed.

Voter registration and turnout in 2015 shows that 5,196,436 registered to vote and 1,509,864 actually voted. In 2016 5,529,742 registered to vote and 3,984,631 actually voted. In 2017 5,489,530 registered to vote and 2,612,309 actually voted. The year 2016 had the largest registration and the largest total voting representing a 6.41% change from 2015.

A winter brews festival is coming to town

The Crozet Winter Brews Festival, a celebration of dark beers from Virginia brewers, will take place December 8, 2018 at Claudius Crozet Park

Taking a cue from the cooler weather and shorter days, the First Annual Crozet Winter Brews Festival will feature Virginia breweries sampling their porters, stouts, and other darker seasonal brews. With both well-known and smaller breweries in attendance, the Festival will offer an exciting tasting experience for dark beer connoisseurs. There will be food trucks, live music, and other entertainment and festivities. A ballot will be provided for visitors to vote on the sampled beers in a friendly yet cutthrout competition resulting in the (soon-to-be) coveted Claudius Awards, bestowed for individual divisions and Best in Show.

"The Claudius Crozet Park Board has discussed holding a beer Festival for a while," says Park Board President Kim Guenther, "But we wanted to find a way to make it stand a part from all the other beer fests in the area. Setting the date in December and focusing on dark beers seemed like a way to make this event truly unique." All proceeds from the Festival will directly support Crozet Park, a non-profit Park owned and operated by the community of Crozet, and its mission of affordable recreation for all.
